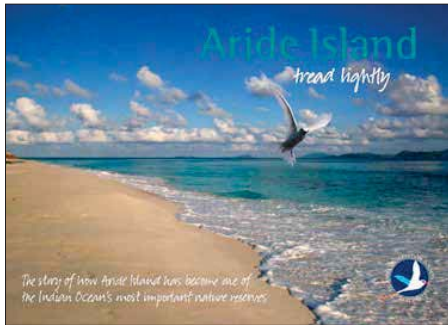
Amongst our trove of uniquely beautiful granitic islands and diverse wildlife, Aride island still stands out as one of the most unique, with stunning species and land-

scape. In celebration of the island's beauty, history and the ongoing work to maintain this ecosystem, "Aride Island - Tread Lightly" was launched.

The publication, which traces the history of Aride from a time when man's footprints pressed

heavily on the island to a time now when man now treads lightly - is a collaboration of the few involved with the island. Wardens, committee members and Seychellois staff, all write about life and work on the island, over its many years as a nature reserve, all the while describing the amazing wildlife which abounds on this small island. Aride is home to one million breeding seabirds, with more species than the other 40 islands combined. It also has endemic birds and endemic plants and a rich marine life. It is also one of the few remaining islands where the past remains visible, a piece of the world as it was before Man.
